New Business

Chairman Dycus said the District needed to appoint a delegate to the Kansas Rural Water Finance Authority Annual Meeting. Jerry Bennett said he would be attending and could represent the District. Alan Hire moved to have Jerry Bennett be the voting delegate for the District. Gary Guetterman seconded the motion. Vote: 6-0, motion passed.

Manager's Report

Chairman Dycus gave the manager's report for Jerry Bennett, since he was out with the flu.

The Louisburg Interconnect Agreement has been reviewed by both entities' legal counsels. The Agreement will be presented to the Louisburg City Council on August 15th for the City's final approval.

The engineers are working on the plans for the intake-VFDs, one pump upgrade and the copper ion screens for the zebra mussel control. A meeting with two copper ion generator suppliers will be scheduled for the next couple of weeks.

The plant is dealing with a high iron and manganese concentration. It is under control by using a high dosage of sodium permanganate. There have been some brown water issues and the staff is flushing throughout the District. We are getting some bad press from Water #7 and the City of Spring Hill on the discolored water. The flushing has pushed the brown water out of the system now. The sodium permanganate cannot be added at a higher rate if the iron & manganese demand is not there. The higher dosage creates another problem of pink/purple water if the iron & manganese demand is not there. The Board needs to consider the possibility of adding another plant operator shift which would require an additional operator. We have a lot of control measures in place during automated operations, but quality control can increase with the addition of another operator. This will be an item to discuss for the 2017 budget. There was discussion on the brown water and prevention of the problem in the future.

The additional internet sites with GoBrolly Communications is complete. Legal counsel reviewed the District's current leases with the stand pipe landowners and determined there is adequate ingress/egress provisions for GoBrolly to have access to the standpipes.

Gary Guetterman moved to adjourn. Glenn Alpert seconded the motion. Vote: 6-0, motion passed.
